I. What I Can Learn Time

The Story and the Success of the Teammates Mentoring Program: Lisa Last

- 1. Started in USD 379 two years ago; one of over 200 schools across the region who has a program and one of 12 in Kansas
- 2. Teammates is for EVERY student, not just those who are considered at-risk
- 3. USD 379 is currently the largest program in Kansas with 69 matches of students with mentors
- 4. Still have 21 students waiting for a match
- 5. 55 mentees improved academically last year, 91% had fewer discipline issues

 - 2. Strong Feelings About Being Alive: Courageous Conversation on 9/2/25
 - a. Strong attendance! (153 people)
 - b. Thank you to CC Arts Council for purchasing the popcorn & drinks
 - c. Thank you to Pawnee for sponsoring the ice cream social
- C. Resources Available Through the **Veterans' Administration**: Ashley Delehanty
 - a. Ashley is a licensed social clinical worker, but now is focused on providing community-based efforts
 - b. Over 1,000 of the 6,000 people in Clay County are veterans or family of veterans
 - c. Ashley wants to help in any way she can with any of your efforts
- D. **Gather for Good Day** 9/18/25: Matt Weller
 - a. 52 funds participating this year (Clay Counts Coalition is one)
 - b. In person at the Clay County Museum from noon to 8:00 pm that day

- E. Parenting with Love and Logic Class 9/4-9/25: Lori Martin
 - a. Partnering with Little Learners on these classes with parents
 - b. 13 parents are participating in the classes
- F. Loving Solutions/ Parent Project Report: Lisa Last
 - a. Lisa is not offering these this semester, but will be offering them again in the spring
 - b. Some are court mandated, but many are not; it is for any parent
- G. Clay County Health Fair on 10/25/25: Allie Fitzgeralds
 - a. CCMC is going to provide vendors at the event
 - b. Advertising is currently taking place (contact Allie if you are interested)
 - i. Window displays at businesses are available
 - ii. Pricing for each lab is included
 - c. The Clay Center Boy Scouts will provide a breakfast for this event
- H. Prenatal Mental Health Training 10/7/25
 - a. Focused on those working with moms of new babies
 - b. A licensed social worker will be the keynote speaker
 - c. CCMC is providing a light supper for the event
 - d. Clay Counts has been asked to provide a mental health basket
 - i. A motion was made for Clay Counts to donate \$100 for this basket. Motion passed unanimously.
 - e. Registration can be found on Clay County Health Department website
- I. Girls on the Run Program: Sofia Gallup and Allie Fitzgeralds
 - a. Just started enrollment campaign (4 girls signed up right now)
 - b. They have space for 15 students, and 15 "running buddies" are needed as well
 - c. Girls enrolled in after school programs in grades 3-5 are eligible
 - d. Clay Counts is funding this program
- J. **Dispatch Student of the Month Sponsorship**: Melanie Musselman
 - a. The Dispatch sponsors a student of the month, which is nominated by the CCCHS staff and created by the CCCHS yearbook staff
 - b. Melanie asked for a sponsor for this feature
 - i. Each month is \$90 or \$810 for the year
 - c. A motion was made for Clay Counts to be a sponsor for the entire year (\$810). Motion passed unanimously.
- K. Clay Counts members have been asked to attend and be part of the Clay Center Multi-Generational Life Center Ground-Breaking Ceremony
 - a. This will take place on Friday, Sept. 26 at 10 a.m.
- L. Courageous Conversation: Movie Can't Look Away October 21st
 - a. This is a documentary about how social media negatively affects our young people and the legal team who is bringing a lawsuit to these companies
 - b. A mother of one of the students who died by suicide (Amy Neville) is coming from Arizona to speak (only charging transportation costs)
 - c. Lori would like to show the video at the October Clay Counts meeting
